The thickly layered recording has multiple guitars, with the most audible strumming root-position chords in the key of E. If you'd like to add a second part or accompany yourself differently, try the alternate chords (in

parentheses) with a capo on the second fret. Randy Meisner's bass line implies an Fim chord on the second line of the first chorus (on the word down) but matches the guitar parts for the second and third choruses.
