## What If I Do?


"What If I Do?" is the second cut on disc two—the acoustic disc—of the Foo Fighters' double CD, *In Your Honor*. Dave Grohl double-tracked acoustic guitars in the right and left channel, giving the rhythm track a stereo effect. Though you


can play the opening riff down at the nut with root-position chords, playing it at the seventh fret allows you to let the open G string ring through, as it does on the recording. You'll also be able to grab that cool C chord at the seventh fret. The open G string and high C note on the E string make this chord sound like it's being played on a high-strung, "Nashvilletuned" guitar. Play the first two measures with your picking-hand fingers, then use your index finger or thumb to strum the chords in measures 3–4.

Repeat the intro riff throughout the verse. Once you reach the chorus, continue strumming through the barre chords shown. In the bridge, Grohl takes advantage of the open B and E strings to make some interesting chord sounds by sliding the bottom four notes of an E-shape barre chord up and down the fretboard.

Throughout the Foo Fighters' recording of the song, the mix is sparingly ornamented with sliding sixths and thirds, as well as arpeggiated chord shapes on electric guitar.
