



The Beach Boys first released "Don't Worry Baby" as a track on their 1964 Capitol Records release *Shut Down Volume 2*. Rock legend has it that Brian Wilson was inspired to write the tune as a response to the Ronettes' 1963 single, "Be My Baby," produced by notorious rock producer (and subject of Wilson's very vocal admiration) Phil Spector.

Try experimenting with a few different strum techniques. Most of the chords

on the recording are supplied by the piano, an effect that can be simulated by playing straight eighth-note downstrokes. If that gets exhausting, feel free to relax the beat a bit and mix in some upstrokes in your own variation of eighth- and quarter-note strums. Once you have the rhythm of the intro riff down, you can also experiment by adding bass notes (the E and A can be played on open strings, and the B can be played with your index finger at the seventh fret).
