


Written nearly 30 years ago, "Redemption Song" remains a true acoustic folk classic, penned by the great reggae missionary, Bob Marley. The most familiar recording of "Redemption Song" is the closing track on *Uprising*, the last studio album Marley would live to release, and features Marley accompanying himself on an acoustic guitar.

The tune begins with the sparse riff below, with no other accompaniment. The hammer-on grace notes are so quick they're barely played, so try to fret your destination note just after you pluck the string to achieve the desired result. A simple chord structure and haunting political message illuminate the centuries-old

struggles of Africans and their descendants around the globe, but Marley extends his invitation to any who will listen: "Won't you help to sing these songs of freedom?" The final D7 chord wants badly to resolve back to G, and yet the song still ends with that overhanging tension, possibly indicating harmonically the unsettled nature of so many social issues.
