## We Shall Overcome

Words and music by Zilphia Horton, Frank Hamilton, Guy Carawan, and Pete Seeger




This anthem of the civil rights era has a complex history. Seeger originally learned it from music teacher Zilphia Horton, who in the 1940s had heard striking tobacco workers sing it in "long meter" style—a slowed-down rendition that allows ample room for harmonizing. According to Seeger, Frank Hamilton and Guy Carawan gave the song a steady 12/8 pulse,

and Seeger himself did the guitar arrangement (and, perhaps, changed "will" to "shall" in the title phrase). All these contributors wound up copyrighting "We Shall Overcome" to keep it from becoming an "insipid pop song," says Seeger. It was his late manager, Harold Leventhal, Seeger explains, who told him, "Pete, you know if

you don't copyright this, some character ou in Hollywood will copyright it, and next thing you know they'll have a version where it says 'Come on, baby, you and me will overcome tonight.'" Seeger and the others stipulated that all royalties go to the We Shall Overcom. Fund, chaired by Bernice Johnson Reagon of Sweet Honey in the Rock, which support black music in the South.

This version is transcribed from If I Had Hammer: Songs of Hope and Struggle (Smithsonian Folksways). Seeger plays 12-string in hocustomary low version of dropped-D (down to B) in the bass), using a 12/8 strum similar to what he plays in "Jacob's Ladder." This triple rhythm (1-2-3 4-5-6 7-8-9 10-11-12 is often heard in slow blues.
